Course Description:

This course involves the design, implementation and presentation a significant software project under faculty supervision.

Student Learning Outcomes

By the successful completion of this course, you will be able to:

- Formulate a plan for project completion
- Construct a software system
- Prepare appropriate system documentation
- Organize and express ideas clearly and convincingly in written form.

Learning Environment:

- This class will be conducted primarily independently, but we will meet every two weeks
 to allow you to provide an update on the project status and to plan the work for the next
 two weeks.
- It is expected that you make progress towards completing your project every two
 weeks. It is imperative that you do not wait until the last week of the semester to
 complete the project. This may result in a grade of failing grade.

Grading:

The course grade will be determined by the successful completion of the significant software project. This project should build upon the documentation which you completed in IT/COMP 491. If you plan to deviate from these documents, please obtain approval from the instructor within the first three weeks of the semester. You are expected to prepare appropriate system level documentation for the project, and you are expected to participate in the Capstone Celebration Poster Session at the end of the semester.
